I am excited to welcome students and staff back to Humboldt Community School District for a new school year. I look forward to seeing the students' excitement as they begin their first day of school, especially the kindergarteners whose educational experience is just beginning. We have a lot of work to do. Administrators and Teacher Leaders have designed a school improvement plan to support students' needs and raise achievement scores. Our teachers will focus on how we instructionally respond when students do not learn. We'll concentrate professional development on improving instructional planning and incorporating teaching strategies to meet the needs of our English Language Learners, Special Education Students, and others identified through our PLC process. Our facilities are ready for the school year. I hosted a community tour on July 10 and was pleased to have enough people to use a bus when



traveling to the different locations. I showed off our impressive facilities, especially the new construction at Humboldt High School and Taft Elementary. Our facilities are much safer. The tour also provided an opportunity to answer questions about our district's enrollment, finances, and the educational opportunities we provide. I am blessed to have this opportunity to serve as Superintendent of Schools in this fantastic community and school district. I look forward to our fall student activities starting soon. The Real Deal

I continue to get great feedback from this portion of the newsletter. Our community members don't want to hear that everything is well; they know education is challenging.

- We just received a school bus that was ordered in November 2022. Bus costs have risen from \$106,000 to \$137,000 in four years, and the order-to-delivery span is about eighteen months.
- We replaced the sprinkler system and resodded the football field. We will be careful with the field use this fall and spring. We may utilize our practice field south of Humboldt Middle School and our soccer field on 8th Street a little more strategically to allow the sod to take root. Our first football game on August 30 is away at Spencer, which provides an extra week before use. You'll know why if you hear in the community that we aren't using the field for an event or team.
- The Summer Food Program was a huge success. Our staff provided about 400 students with seven days of breakfast and lunch, including milk. It was very challenging to communicate, organize, and staff. Melinda Busick, Food Service Director, Kayli Lanam, and the rest of our team did an outstanding job.
- A new school year brings some handbook changes. In middle school, students must keep their cell phones in their lockers. At the high school, students may be required to leave cell phones in storage as they enter the classrooms. They can grab them back as they go. A significant change at the high school will be that once the school day has begun, for security reasons, all students will enter and exit the building in the new front office on the north side. That means students will have a longer walk outside to get to and from the parking lot. The administrators are assigning sections of the west parking to each grade level. Students with senior release are assigned parking sections closest to the new office. The handbook changes will provide a better, safer educational experience for all.
- Help wanted! We are still short several special education paraeducators. The pay rate starts at \$15.00 per hour. The benefits are great and it's a chance to make a difference.
